Hearts for Hospice February Fundraiser

Hearts for Hospice is a fundraiser that was a result of the VHHP Board members getting creative when the pandemic shut down much of our area. While we were able to still conduct the membership and Lights of Love campaigns via mailings, we were unable to hold in person fundraising events. The board noticed a huge hit in funds due to the lack of these in-person events. The Hearts for Hospice campaign came together quite quickly with the help of partnering local businesses.

Local businesses partnered with VHHP by selling Hearts in memory of a loved one for \$5. Decorated coin buckets were also put out at partnering businesses to collect change.

VHHP also partnered with the North Woods Elementary for a week-long coin drive competition. The grade with the most coins collected for the week received an extra recess time. A great incentive for our kids last school year!

Hearts for Hospice Campaign brought in over \$1600 between hearts, coin cans and coin drive last February. VHHP plans on expanding portions of the Hearts for Hospice Fundraiser by partnering with more businesses and expanding the coin drive into the High School in 2022.

Starting the Conversation Hospice Foundation of America

The most common comment that HFA hears from patients and families is that they wish they had experienced hospice earlier in the illness.

As with any important decision, an open, frank discussion that isn't occurring in the midst of a crisis can be helpful. If you plan a discussion with loved ones about your preferences regarding medical care should you become unable to make decisions for yourself-called an advanced directive-HFA recommends expanding the discussion to include your preferences for end-of-life care.

There are many ways to start the conversation about end-of-life preferences:

- Watch the PBS Frontline documentary *Being Mortal* with loved ones.
- The *Hello* game, available from *commonpractice.com*, can provide a way to easily discuss issues that are difficult to bring up.
- *Fivewishes.org*, when completed with a loved one, can lead to conversations about care preferences.
- A "Starter Kit" with tools and tips can be found at *theconversationproject.org*

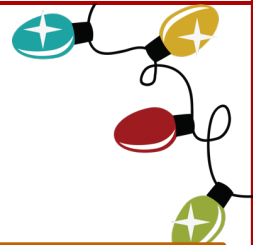
Many experts recommend having such a conversation around holidays, when family is gathered together. And some people may find it easier to skip the conversation altogether and to record their preferences in a living will, dated letter, other legal document, or even an email.

You can also speak with your healthcare provider about your preferences and options during a routine appointment. As long as you can competently communicate, none of your decisions are permanent; you can always change your mind about your course of treatment and type of care at a later date.

If the conversation does not happen until an advanced serious illness or condition exists, which is often the case, you or a healthcare provider may initiate the discussion about treatment and care. Sometimes, a healthcare provider does not suggest alternatives to curative efforts. It is then incumbent on you to raise the issue with your provider. Remember that anyone associated with your care may be helpful in this case. If you are more comfortable discussing these issues with a nurse, a nurse's aide, or a physician's assistant than with your physician, start there and ask them to help.

2021 VHHP Scholarship Recipients

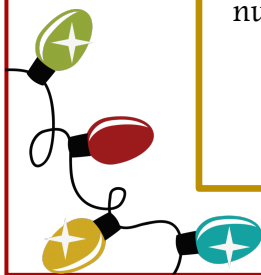
Each Spring VHHP awards two North Woods high school seniors each a \$500 scholarship and one college student \$1000 scholarship as they pursue careers in a medical field.
